I write to request information regarding the Augusta, Georgia Land Bank Authority's (AGLBA) utilization of \$1 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. AGBLA is a public entity which works on behalf of Augusta-Richmond County to "identify, improve, reactivate and redistribute vacant, abandoned, and dilapidated properties for housing, economic, and civic purposes." My office was asked to investigate claims of misused federal ARPA funds by AGBLA.

In October 2022, AGLBA requested \$1 million in funding as part of a memorandum of understanding with the City of Augusta.<sup>2</sup> The Augusta Commission agreed on November 1, 2022 to provide AGLBA with \$1 million from the American Rescue Plan Act, meant to go towards the "upkeep or demolition of property to combat blight." However, it has been reported that AGBLA may have misused those funds, including expending these funds on staff pay raises, dinners and meals, and to finance various trips.4

My office was informed that the ARPA funds appropriated from the Augusta Commission were Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF). SLFRF funds had four allowable uses:

- 1. Public health and negative economic impacts;
- 2. To provide premium pay to workers who had to work during the pandemic;
- 3. To provide for government services that would have otherwise been cut due to a lack of revenue coming in during the pandemic; and
- 4. To make necessary investments in sewer, water, or broadband infrastructure.<sup>5</sup>
